Would you be interested in taking part in a study to find out about the experiences of children and their families living with autism?

Study Name: Changes in Autism?

Description: The purpose of this study is to find out about the experiences of children and their families living with autism. We conducted a similar survey 10 years ago, and we are interested in possible changes that might exist with respect to methods of diagnosis, as well as differences in assessment, treatment and type of educational services available for school-aged children on the autism spectrum. The survey is online so participants can complete it in a place of their choice, either on their computer, laptop, phone or similar device. The complete questionnaire usually takes about 60 minutes to complete.
