ACT Events in 2015





In 2015, ACT hosted 26 events, providing 39 training days in six communities in B.C. Three evening presentations were offered in Punjabi.

Kamloops, Kelowna, Prince George, Sidney, Surrey and Vancouver

Over 1,900 people attended an ACT event gaining over 12,500 hours of training. 33 dedicated workshop volunteers provided 300 volunteer hours, aiding the overall success of our workshops.

Over \$24,000 was awarded in bursaries in the form of reduced event registration fees to encourage participants to attend from across B.C.
