Day 1: Social Thinking - Informal Dynamic Assessment and Core Treatment Strategies

You will begin the day by exploring how to better understand the inner minds of individuals with social learning challenges. The Informal Dynamic Social Thinking Assessment includes four unique assessment tasks, shown through video, to uncover how our students process and respond to social information in real-time. You will explore and engage in activities related to three core Social Thinking Treatment Frameworks:

- » Social Behavior Mapping (SBM)
- » Pyramid of Friendships
- » The Spirals of Social Anxiety

To round out the day, you will cover basic concepts and ideas for running Social Thinking groups.

Day 2: Master Class – Exploring Key Social Communication Concepts through Hands-On Activities

This conference day gets very high marks from attendees! The focus of this day is to take attendees on a deeper dive into core Social Thinking strategies through the use of video clips and hands-on practice using treatment goody bags. If you've already learned the Social Thinking basics from attending different conference days or reading published materials, then this day will be right up your alley as it helps to make better sense out of your real-time observations while creating treatment tools in a way not offered before.

Those attending this day will receive the new Cascade of Social Attention Checklist, practice lessons by using popsicle sticks and playing cards and learn one way in which a digital camera can literally change the face of your treatment. You'll also receive samples of how all this information can be represented in IEP goals and rubrics for measuring change. How an individual's competencies and focus of treatment change across 5, 10 and 15 years will be explored through longitudinal videos of four different clients.

Day 1: Executive Function Skills in the Classroom

If you are a teacher, special educator or someone who co-teaches in the classroom, this day is for you! Strong executive function skills enable us to imagine and plan a "dry run" of the task in our mind before we begin to carry out the plan. Topics include:

- » Future Thinkers: A New View of Executive Function Skills
- » Self-Regulation and Situational Awareness
- » Being a Beat Ahead: Following Routines, Initiating Tasks, Making Transitions
- » The Get Ready, Do, Done Model

Day 2: Specialized Instruction in Executive Function Skills

This specialized Executive Function skills training defines, demonstrates and practices executive function skill interventions with hands-on activities. Sarah Ward will briefly review the 360 Thinking Model of Executive Function Skills. The seminar will cover, in depth, the practical aspects of treatment planning and implementation and provide new therapeutic strategies such as:

- » Situational intelligence
- » Self-monitor passage of time
- » Breaking down of complex tasks

It reflects current research and evidence-based practice in teaching students with ASD. This course includes pre-reading, practical hands-on activities, demonstration, coaching and application exercises, as well as a variety of ways of evaluating participant learning. It is a requirement for teaching assistants in many school districts and is open to community professionals and parents.

Kenneth Cole is a Registered Psychologist on staff at POPARD and a School Psychologist in the Surrey School District. Dr. Cole has presented this course for ACT for several years and has been given rave reviews by participants.
