Topic: An Aboriginal Perspective on Supporting Children and Families with Special Needs

Presenter: Rona Sterling-Collins (Quistletko), MSW; *Nlakapamux Nation, Professional and Parent* **Details:** Rona will share some of the work she's assisted with in her communities around special needs. She will discuss the importance of wrapping services around the family as a whole rather than only the child or individual, in order to maximize positive outcomes. Drawing on her own experiences as the mother of a son with autism on the verge of adulthood, and the many other families she has supported, she will share strategies that have helped her son and family. She will also discuss ideas and strategies that would be helpful for rural and remote Aboriginal families and communities.

Wednesday September 28th 1pm-4pm

Topic: Information and Supports across BC for Individuals with ASD and Their Families

Presenter: Louise Broadley; *Manager of Autism Information Services, Autism Community Training* **Details**: This presentation provides an overview of ACT services including individualized support from ACT information officers and online information and community resources to help families navigate autism services available in B.C. The presenter will discuss strategies for maximizing the impact of a child's autism funding, strategies for setting up a team in a small community and the importance of collaboration between professionals and families.
