ACT's 13th Annual Focus on Research Conference will provide a forum for community professionals, researchers, and families to consider the complex realities facing individuals with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and mental health conditions, including anxiety, depression and obsessive compulsive disorder. We are also interested in including presentations related to other neurological conditions.

We wish to elicit contributions from researchers, clinicians and policy specialists from across Canada with experience in the complex area of identifying and treating children and adults with ASD who also face mental health challenges.

Our goal is to build relationships between researchers, community-based clinicians, community organizations and families to facilitate the collaboration that is required to better support under-served members of our communities. In particular, we are hoping to provide researchers with the important research questions that the community wishes to have answered by incorporating panel discussions during the conference, as well as to listen to research findings that can help us consider the way forward.

Parts of this conference may be live streamed internationally. Registration will open January 27th, 2017.

To promote research and practice that furthers the development of government funded mental health services that are responsive to the full range of needs of children and adults with ASD, and other neuro-developmental conditions.

Topics we wish to include:

- » Addressing policy and practice that poses barriers to children and adults with ASD receiving government funded mental health services;
- The additional barriers faced by those from culturally diverse and rural and remote families, including Aboriginal families, seeking mental health services;
- » How Canadian clinicians, educators and policy makers can better respond to these needs.
- » Practical presentations that target key concepts that community health professionals can use in their daily practice when offering services to children and adults with ASD and other neuro-developmental conditions.

We invite applications from:

- » Researchers, academics and policy specialists from across Canada and beyond.
- » Community professionals including public and private diagnosticians, psychologists and physicians, educators, social workers, Infant Development Program consultants; Aboriginal Infant Development Program consultants; speech- language pathologists; occupational therapists and behavior consultants:
- » Presenters who are supporting individuals and families with ASD and/or other disabilities with diverse cultural backgrounds or in rural or remote settings.
