

ACT's Community Training 2003 - 2016

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Live Events

ACT's Live Training program has made a major contribution to the autism community in British Columbia starting in 2003. Between 2010 and 2016, ACT provided 14,000 registrants with over 100,000 hours of training at a total of 124 events, in three languages, in 14 communities across B.C. This training was made possible through the commitment of our presenters to share their knowledge and a pool of volunteers who allowed us to provide these opportunities at non-commercial prices, in addition to the crucial support of sponsors and donors.¹

ACT's live training events have provided practical, evidence-based learning opportunities to family members, professionals and para-professionals in communities across British Columbia. They have addressed fundamental topics and issues that are pertinent to a wide-range of ages and for varying levels of abilities across the autism spectrum. While these events teach skills, and demonstrate practical applications on how to support individuals with autism, the topics and learning outcomes are often applicable and useful to the greater special needs population. ACT offers group discounts to encourage intervention teams and colleagues to come together and reinforce the learning and implementation after the event. Everyone is welcome and while the events are priced as low-cost as ACT can manage, ACT provides bursaries to participants who must travel, or are under financial stress - regardless of diagnosis.

ACT hosts an Information Table at these events, an additional opportunity to provide information services to attendees and to promote ACT's resources.


ACT's Community Training Program 2003 – 2016

The training that ACT has provided over the last 13 years in the Lower Mainland, at no expense to the taxpayer, has had a profound effect on:

- Raising parental understanding and expectation of what autism intervention programs and educational programs should look like for their children;
- Empowering parents with knowledge about the crucial role they play in maximizing the therapeutic environment for their children in the home and community;
- Educating professionals on the potential of individuals with autism and how they can improve their practice whether they are an educator or a RASP Professional;
- Allowing professionals and para-professionals to earn high quality CEU's in the area of autism.

ACT's Live Events are Held in High Regard

The positive reputation of ACT's events is evident from the results of ACT's Resources and Services Survey 2016. 94% of Family Members and 98% of RASP Professionals "Strongly Agreed or "Somewhat Agreed" that Live Events are helpful. Attendees consider them professional, relevant, organized and accessible

New: Live Web Streaming for Focus on Research Event

Parts of the Focus on Research 2016 conference was made available via live web streaming video to registered viewers. This was an important step to increase accessibility to viewers across the province. The web streaming included a text-based chat function, and attendees took that opportunity to share information with other online attendees. All MCFD Special Needs Social Workers were extended a

special invitation to attend free of charge. Attendees came from all areas of the province, and included 10 MCFD Special Needs Social Workers.

Autism Videos @ ACT – available when, where and as often as you want

As B.C.'s largest provider of community-level autism training and support, ACT knows that not everyone can attend live events. Autism Videos @ ACT (AVA) is an innovative approach to parent and professional training – putting free videos online increases accessibility, for those for whom attending a live event is not possible, including extended family members and community professionals.

Autism Videos @ ACT covers practical topics that address issues across the lifespan of individuals with autism. Grounded in research and good practices, they provide reliable, non-commercial information to help professionals and parents maximize the positive impact of providing fun and functional therapy for children with ASD. Many videos are relevant to a variety of children with special needs other than autism.

Growth and Evolution of ACT's Online Videos: 2007 - 2016

From 2007 to 2012, ACT's online videos were available to users for a small annual fee. In 2012, ACT dropped all sign-up fees; registration numbers immediately increased for all online videos. In 2015, using donations, ACT launched a new platform Autism Videos @ ACT.

In 2016, ACT held its inaugural Seymour Triple G fundraising and awareness event to raise funds for Autism Videos @ ACT. Funding is essential to support the delivery of free online training across British Columbia.

About the Videos: Accessible and Professional

ACT videos are of high quality both in content and production values. The focus of these videos is on practical information that will help parents be better consumers. Based on a decade of working with families, ACT believes that informing families is the first step to ensure best outcomes for their children.

ACT hosts 21 free online videos at www.actcommunity.ca/mentalhealth. AVA's presentations range from 1 to 4 hours, divided into short sections to help navigation and accommodate busy lives. There are also links to additional or referenced information resources.

They are accessible:

- No password or login is required to watch the videos.
- Available in high and low-definition, to support lower-speed Internet
- On desktop, tablet or smart phone.

They are professional:

- Videos are professionally filmed and edited;
- Speakers are experts in their field, and speak compellingly on evidence-based training;
- Technical help, though rarely required, is available at: www.actcommunity.ca/videohelp.

Eight Videos Released in 2016

ACT released eight new videos in 2016, in two different languages. This is more than 24 additional hours of free online training available to families and professionals. AVA hosts over 50 hours of training, available online anytime, anyplace and to anyone.



Autism Videos @ ACT – a Valued Part of Autism Training

Those who have used the Autism Videos @ ACT (AVA) value them highly, as seen in ACT's 2016 survey. 96% of those surveyed find the Autism Videos @ ACT Agreed or Strongly Agreed that the free online videos are helpful.

Comments show also that people value the videos because:

- They can watch them with their peers or partner.
- They can access them at any time (analytics show there is a bump in page views after 8pm!)
- Online training saves in travel costs, providing access to professional speakers.

Statistics are for the twelve-month period December 3, 2015 – December 2, 2016.

AVA videos were played nearly 10,000 times over the last 12 months; nearly 1,800 hours of video training delivered.

Future Plans

ACT has a number of recorded presentations awaiting editing, pending staff and financial resources. With funding, ACT would be able to create subtitles in English and other languages, to make the videos accessible to the hard of hearing and those for whom English is a second or unfamiliar language. This would increase the reach of training to extended families for many.
